

Into Each Life a Little Rain Must Fall?

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Rediscovering Faith in God
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Most people have heard the expression, "Into each life, a little rain must fall." This is usually used to mean that each person faces difficulties in this life. While this is true, it isn't a Scripture. In fact, rain in the Bible often refers to a blessing from God rather than hard times.

When Jesus told His disciples to love their enemies and to pray for those who persecuted them. He said that in doing this, they would be like their Father in heaven, because "He makes His sun rise on the evil and on the good, and sends rain on the just and the unjust," (Mt. 5:45).

In other words, the sun and the rain are given by God as a BLESSING to those who deserve it and to those who don't. He didn't say He sends trouble to the just and unjust, but *blessings*.

This is important to know so that we do not mistake troubles as coming from God and are thus able to resist them in His name.
